

i. Get the Text

St. Ambrose: "Pay attention to the choice of individual words and their meanings."

Hippolytus of Rome: "Let us strive to arrive at an understanding of the divine realities, not according to our intelligence... but in the madder he himself has wanted to reveal himself in the Sacred Scriptures."





II. Let the Text Get You

"If you want to preach to the heart, you need to preach *from* the heart... What is required is that as you speak it becomes evident... that you yourself have been humbled, wounded, healed, comforted, and exalted by the truths you are presenting, and that they have genuine power in your life."


